DISSERTATION PROJECT

Fighting in the Future Tense:

Norm Collision and Imaginaries in the Emergence of Autonomous Weapons

Within the current global security environment, several new military technologies hold the potential to transform warfare fundamentally and—by extension—how international actors use force toward political ends. In particular, autonomous weapon systems (AWS) emerged as a focal point of normative contestation at the global, domestic, and institutional levels. My research focuses on why the US, as the pre-eminent military power, is developing this weapons technology despite growing normative arguments against AWS at the international level. I draw on historical and discursive methods to argue that a collision between incompatible norm regimes, one within global governance structures and another across global security cultures, accounts for this disjuncture. My research suggests that international politics, in a profoundly constructivist sense, is embedded in the process of creating new military technologies like autonomous weapons via the logic of what I call the strategic imaginary.
